Christine Harron (15 yrs.) reported missing in 1993. In 1999, OPP investigation failed to locate her body or solve her disappearance. In 2004, suspect confessed to her murder and at trial the statement ruled inadmissible and the charges stayed. In 2012, an OPP led covert operation initiated in hopes of gaining further evidence against the suspect.





Kayliegh Ivall (14 yrs.) reported missing and body located in remote area. Victim was in a relationship with 15 yr. old female suspect and both were associated to the Dilico Anishinabek Family Care services. Female suspect was also in an intimate relationship with an adult male, who admitted to being present for Katie's murder.
