- Be of good moral character and habits.
- Be physically and mentally able to perform the duties of the position, having regard to your safety and the safety of the public.
- Be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident of Canada.
- Have no criminal conviction(s) for which a pardon has not been granted.
- Successful completion of the mandatory certification and recertification courses as required.
- Successful completion of the 16-week Basic training program.
- Proficient in English, including being able to speak, write, read, and understand English.
- Valid Standard First Aid Level C certification.
- Valid G-Class driver's license.
- At least eighteen (18) years of age.
